## Latest APS Middle School Proposal

The School Board will make its final decision on middle school expansion on June 17. If you have views on any of the proposals, now is the time to express them at [www.arlington.k12.va.us/page/3052](http://www.arlington.k12.va.us/page/3052).

Lyon Village is quite likely to have a new middle school in 2018 or 2019. **If you currently have an elementary schooler, this will impact you.**

One option would house three disconnected programs under one roof at the Wilson site: the 6-12 H-B Woodlawn program, the Stratford program (a secondary school program for students with special needs), and a 600-seat neighborhood middle school, creating a 1,300-seat school. Condition of Private Property, home-owners are responsible for maintaining their lawns and keep sidewalks clear of vegetation, as stated in §10-13. Duty of Property Owner to Cut Grass, Weeds, Maintain Lawns, Etc. and §10-15. Duty of Each Property Owner or Occupant of Property to Cut Back Obstructing Vegetation. ## Report a Pothole and More

If your street needs a pothole filled, please report it. Don't assume that your neighbor has or that the county knows about it. Arlington County has an online tool for reporting them: <http://topics.arlingtonva.us/reportproblem/>. The online form is not just for potholes. The same tool can be used to report a wide range of non-emergency issues, including broken street lights, signs, graffiti and more.

## Pet Owner Etiquette

Please remember your legal (and neighborly) duties as a dog owner:

- a) When outside, always keep your dog under your control on a leash (Arlington Code 2-5(A)) (except at designated dog park). Don't let them into your neighbors' yards. As one neighbor writes: "Dog waste can contribute to diseases that animals pass to humans. Infected eggs of certain roundworms and other parasites can linger in the soil for years. Anyone who comes into contact with that soil runs the risk of coming into contact with those eggs. Children are most susceptible, since they often play on the lawn or in the dirt and put things in their mouths or eyes."
- b) Always clean up after your pet (even if walking at night, down back alleys), and place the bag in your own receptacle (Arl. Code 2-5(B)).
- c) Do not let your dog bark for more than a minute or two inside or out (if the sound crosses your property lines) (Arl. Code 15-7). If it does, it is your responsibility to correct this behavior. Please train your dog.
- d) Please refrain from walking your dog past homes with dogs who bark at you – the neighbors of the barking dog will appreciate it.
