Street Work Update

Much street work has occurred over the summer. The crosswalk at Key Blvd. and N. Herndon was repainted. A slurry coating was applied to Franklin Road. And milling and repaving continues on a number of streets in the eastern part of Lyon Village. All speed humps are to be restored. We are still working to get a speed hump restored from last summer's paving projects.

Development Update

2311 Wilson Blvd. – Clean Technology Building. Construction for this office and retail building at N. Adams Street broke ground in August. Pile driving is complete and excavation is ongoing. The Custis Road path from N. Adams to Wilson Blvd. across the site is permanently closed and the path along the edge of the apartment building is temporarily closed during excavation. Alternative paths to Wilson are along Adams next to the new Hyatt Place Hotel or through the Key School parking lot to Veitch Street.

2401 Wilson – Hyatt Place Hotel. The hotel was completed in August and is now open for business.

2401 Wilson – BeaconCrest Homes. Construction is nearing completion for the four new homes on 16th Street behind the hotel. The sidewalk connecting to Adams Street has been rebuilt and is open.

Red Top Cab development. Still no word on a construction start date for the block bordered by 13th Street N, Washington Blvd., and the Beacon apartment building.
