#### Leaf Vacuum Collection Begins Nov. 8

The county collects and recycles your leaves through vacuum trucks, biodegradable bags, and in your green organics cart. The first pass for Lyon Village is scheduled for November 12 - 17. The second pass is scheduled for December 4 - 8.

These dates can change due to weather and other factors so keep an eye out for the signs the county posts just prior to each pass. Biodegradable collection bags are available for pick-up 8am-5pm in the lobby at 2100 Clarendon Blvd. These can be placed on the curb on the regular Lyon Village trash pick-up day.

## Police Host 7th Annual Fill the Cruiser Holiday Toy Drive Events, Nov. 11- Dec. 3

Upon arrival, participants should stay in their vehicle until they reach the unloading areas, where officers will be on hand to remove donations from their vehicle. A separate area will be available for those arriving by bike or foot.

## Update: Key Blvd. Water Main Replacement Project

The project, which started in August at the corner of Key Blvd and Jackson Street, is continuing to move east. The team is now working on wrapping up work on Herndon Street between Jackson and Key. This project will replace the main water main along Key from Jackson. to Danville St. This new line will replace an existing and aging water main, which was built in 1927. The proposed water main will improve fire flow capacity and support the future demand in the neighborhood. If you have questions about the project, you can call the county at 703-228-7527. ## Learn How to Be the Help Until Help Arrives, Nov. 18

Don't miss Until Help Arrives, an in-person event on November 18 from 6:30-8 pm. Until Help Arrives instructors will teach you skills to respond to traumatic injuries from a car crash, events like an active shooting, or household injury. Learn how to maintain situational awareness, stop the bleeding, move and position the injured, and provide psychological support to the wounded. This national campaign teaches the general public how to be better prepared for and respond to life-threatening situations and injuries.

This training, offered by Arlington CERT members, will review essential concepts such as: maintaining situational awareness, identifying key life threats, stopping bleeding, moving and positioning the injured, and providing psychological support and comfort to the wounded.
